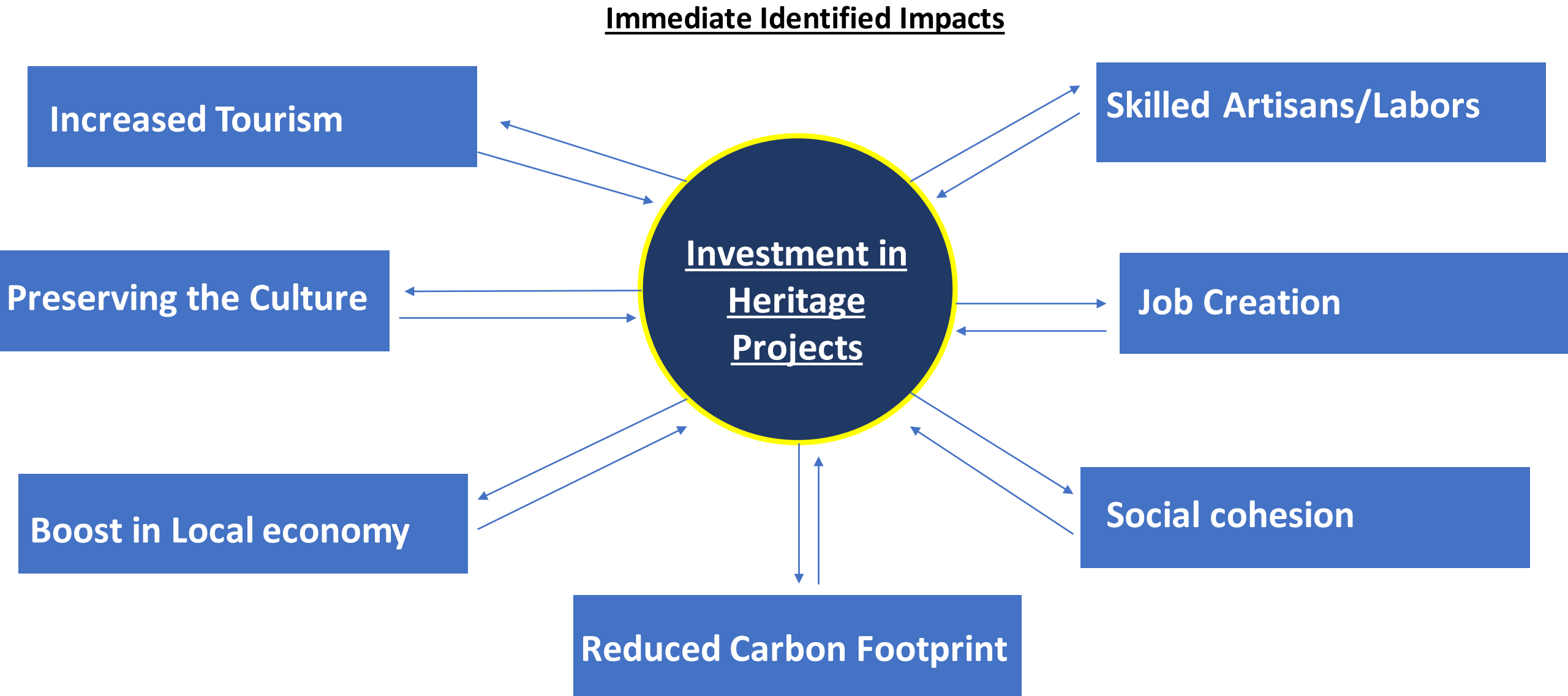


What are the policies and resources that are earmarked for the safeguarding and enhancing of cultural heritage?

- For Conservation works of Category I & II heritage buildings the Central & State Government Archeological rules apply
- All conservation works adhere to the strict policies laid down by ASI
- Funds are earmarked by the respective Archeology Ministry and Department
- These heritage buildings preserve history and are strictly for viewing purpose only no adaptive reuse of these structures are permitted

- For buildings which are not notified fall under the control of Urban Local Body (Nagar Nigam) or Private owners
- Due to limited fund & technical know-how availability with ULB conservation programs are restricted
- ULB seeks convergence for funds & technical know-how with other programs such as Smart City, Dept of Tourism, Dept of Culture, etc.
- Assets post completion are handed to ULB for operations and revenue generation

What are the distinct policies that could benefit from integrating cultural heritage and their expected outcomes ?



Policies and resources that are NOT earmarked but can safeguard to enhance cultural heritage

- ULBs can prepare separate policies for Heritage conservations/augmentations subject to approval from Urban Administration & Development Department
- **Enhanced Public Participation** from local stakeholders & citizens will greatly impact the acceptance of any intervention
- **Dedicated empowered local body** for identification and developing SOPs for conservation of non notified/private Heritage assets
- **Reserved funds** in the ULB dedicated for conservation & restoration of heritage assets

GWL SMART CITY

- Gwalior Smart City Proposal was developed with more than 1.3 lakh citizens participating in feedback for ABD area selection and projects selection
- MOUs signed with multiple departments/stakeholders/institutions for assistance and coordination
- Regular Smart City Advisory Forum Meeting (SCAF) including public representatives, trade associations, education institutions and other nominated members

Going Forward...

- Learnings from Leuven which can be replicated for projects which have social impact such as Pedestrian zone
- Ongoing best practices (technology & civil) in conservation by Leuven which can be shared with Gwalior for Heritage projects
- Replicable Framework for effective stakeholder management
- Policy Framework for conservation of Heritage buildings owned by Private sector (financial or nonfinancial remuneration)
