






Our solution

- Common "spectacles" through co-creation and learning through transnational learning.
- Horizontal triple-helix coordination, though intermittent dialogue rounds
- Gap-analysis of need in innovation networks (Ostrobothnian Model of Smart Specialisation)
- Bottom-up perspective in a multi-level dialogue i.e issues vs. governance model








Some lessons learned

- We work in a different 3H contexts and the dialogue requires as methodology. Intermittent 3H dialogue rounds have contributed new insights and higher partner expectations.
- The implementation of the GD will require a regional innovation framework and concluding on discoveries
- The key to the transnational learning and ownership on the development is to understand your own context
