WHAT IS THE IUC?

The International Urban Cooperation (IUC) programme aims to enable cities and regions to link up and share solutions to common problems.

It is part of a long-term strategy by the **European Union** to foster sustainable urban development in cooperation with both the public and private sectors.

The IUC programme activities will support the achievement of bilateral policy objectives as well as major international agreements on urban development and climate change, such as the Urban Agenda, the Sustainable Development Goals, and the Paris Agreement.

WEST ATHENS AND MÉRIDA FOCUS ON SOCIAL PARTICIPATION IN SUSTAINABLE URBAN MOBILITY PLANNING

Through their partnership, West Athens and Mérida are establishing a strategic approach to developing effective Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans (SUMPs), as well as finding ways to better involve societal stakeholders in the implementation process.

SUMPs must aim to meet the demand for urban mobility whilst improving quality of life. To be successful, SUMPs should be developed across different policy areas and sectors, in cooperation with different levels of government and administration, and in conjunction with citizens and other stakeholders.

Social participation is a vital component of SUMPs. Social participation can take many forms, from consultative means, such as polls, which gauge whether mobility projects have sufficient acceptance levels from the public, to pro-active processes, such as crowd-funding,



ROTTERDAM AND SURAT TAKE AN INTEGRATED APPROACH TO RESILIENT WATER MANAGEMENT

Rotterdam and Surat were officially paired as part of the IUC programme in 2017, but have been collaborating since 2015 within the 100 Resilient Cities network. Both cities have a resilience strategy in which resilient water management and climate resilience are a priority. The cities are focusing their IUC partnership on tackling issues related to water management, such as improving the quality of drinking water, mitigating water pollution from industrial and agricultural run-off, protecting against flooding, and effectively treating sewage.

Taking a holistic approach to challenges can result in significant cross-sectoral benefits. Instead of looking at problems in silos, try connecting the different elements of a system so that you can approach it as a whole. This often means working with other departments and stakeholders.

One specific area of cooperation is water quality monitoring. Surat was inspired by Rotterdam's integrated water management approach, where several parties monitor water quality aligned to collectively set goals and methods. Surat's approach to water topics has inspired Rotterdam to think in a different way. Tackling water management on a much grander scale has encouraged the Dutch city to look at the scalability of its own efforts on climate resilience.




PARMA AND FREDERICTON DEVELOP A NEW PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT MODEL TO INCREASE INCLUSION

Following an exploration of the two cities' priorities, Parma and Fredericton are focusing their IUC cooperation on increasing female participation in local government leadership and creating a transferable public engagement model that actively addresses the issue of inclusiveness for marginalised groups.

The aim of the pairing is to develop a methodology to assess and identify obstacles to the development of women's careers. This methodology will be designed to be both transferable to other countries and applicable to other marginalised segments of the population.

The city authorities reached out to the University of Parma for support in designing the methodology.

Though the tool developed Parma and Fredericton will examine the impact of legislative intervention on barriers to female participation in local government leadership positions.
